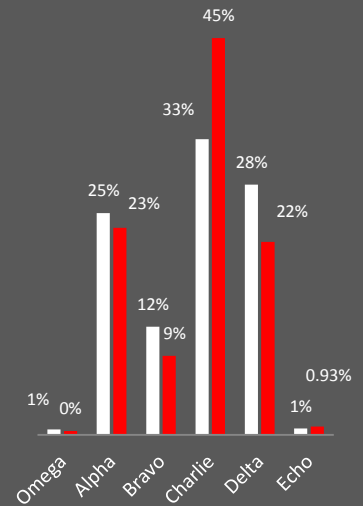
HEALTH PROJECTS

- Total Service Calls provided during the week were 51 and total handling time inclusive of all service levels were **9 minutes** and **33 seconds**.

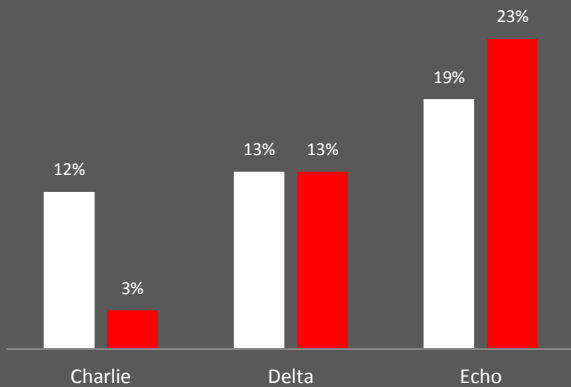
EMS

- Total interventions of 1394, meant a decrease of 6 percent from last week.
- Life threatening cases handled were 23 percent.
- Serious cases handled were 53 percent, totaling an A and B case load of 76 percent.
- A total of 13 Echo calls were handled, out of which 3 were delayed.
- Average response time was 7.8 minutes per intervention.

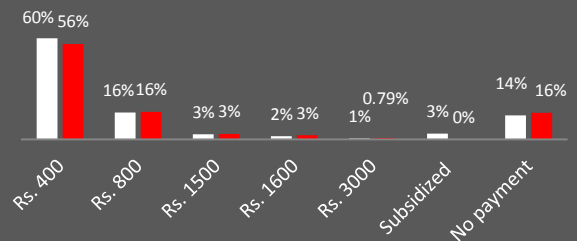
■ Average Interventions ■ w102
